Cover Message

Dear members of APOS,

It is my pleasure to inform all of you about the first major project of the newly formed ASEAN Paediatric Orthopaedic Society (APOS). As most of you may already know, POSNA has been collaborating with ASEAN Ortho Association (AOA) to organize basic training courses on Paediatric Orthopaedics every two years, for the last 12 years. The last event was held in Khon Kaen, Thailand, end of 2017. Due to heavy event loads at the end of the year, we have decided to change the date of this event to January 2019, instead of the usual Oct / Nov period. For the same reason, we hope that more surgeons/ residents will be free to attend the course.

There will be a few modifications in the program in the upcoming course. For the first time, we will have an interactive session (small group discussions) to allow the POSNA faculty to communicate more directly with our participants. We will also try to organize more workshops / demonstrations on various basic procedures in Paediatric Orthopaedics. Equally important is that the faculty are basically world experts or opinion leaders of various fields, and they can provide most up-to-date knowledge on various subjects. Prof Perry S has vast experience in different types of pelvic osteotomy / acetabuloplasty, while Prof Kerr Graham from Melbourne is world expert in Cerebral Palsy. Both Eric Gordon and Klane White have been actively involved in POSNA courses including the annual International Pediatric Orthopaedic Symposium (IPOS). Prof Mathew Dobbs is currently in charge of International Club Foot Congress, and this is probably the most advanced global platform for experts to discuss about advances in Clubfoot management. Finally, we have Prof Ken Kuo, Prof Bobby Ng from Hong Kong and Dr Scott Hoffinger who are very familiar with conditions we faced in this region, and have good experience in teaching and training of Paediatric Orthopaedics in developing countries. You may notice that there will be minimal input from our local or regional faculty, because we would like to learn from those who voluntarily travel half way across the world to be here.

We hope that all those interested will register early so that we can plan for the group discussions and workshops. Hopefully this format will serve as a new program template for future courses. Thank you.

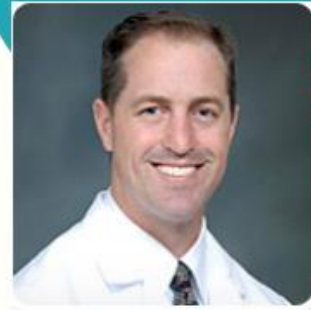

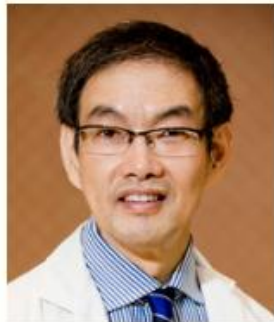
